Several presentations by dignitaries preceded the concert. Woodbury First Selectman Paul Hinckley read a special proclamation from Connecticut Governor Jodi Rell declaring June 29, 2008 Leroy Anderson Day in Connecticut. Rolf Anderson, a son of the composer, read a letter of congratulations from President George W. Bush. Congressman Chris Murphy presented a special recognition from the United States Congress.

The program included popular Anderson compositions including "Sandpaper Ballet," "The Syncopated Clock" and "Serenata," along with many lesser-known pieces.

Members of the composer's family in attendance included daughter Jane Anderson Vercelli, son Kurt Anderson the composer's widow, Eleanor Anderson, as well as many cousins from Connecticut.
