The Candlewood Brass Quintet gave a concert at the Leroy Anderson House in Woodbury, Connecticut on Sunday, May 21, 2023 at 3 p.m. The quintet performed music by J.S. Bach, Gustav Holst, Arthur Sullivan, George Gershwin, John Philip Sousa, and Leroy Anderson

The program included four pieces by Leroy Anderson: *Bugler's Holiday*, *Serenata, The Syncopated Clock*, and the world premiere of the Thomas Hundemer arrangement for brass quintet of *Summer Skies* which Leroy Anderson wrote in 1953, the same year in which the Leroy Anderson House was built. An audience of more than one hundred people enjoyed the excellent performances by the Candlewood Brass Quintet which took place on the terrace and lawn at the Leroy Anderson House.
