Jeanne Farewell has performed in the United States, Europe, and the Far East. Her performances in the U.S. have included the Yale Center for British Art, Harvard Musical Association, Steinway Hall, the American Landmark Festivals and other venues in New York, Boston, San Francisco, Washington D.C., and many concert series in the northeast.

Abroad, she has been solo recitalist in London's Wigmore Hall and the Royal Festival Hall complex, and in Scotland's University of Edinburgh and in Glasgow. European recitals have included Vienna's Schubertsaal and performance in Germany.

She has given solo recitals in China at the Shanghai Conservatory of Music, Beijing Conservatory of Music, and the Shanghai Concert Hall.

Farewell has been broadcast performing live on WQXR classical radio in NYC.

She studied at Juilliard Pre-College, Boston Conservatory and Manhattan School of Music, and also graduated in Art History from Vassar College.

Farewell's background lends itself to programs associating music, art, and literature. She trained in studio art at the

American Academy of Design and Parsons School of Design, and her paintings have been shown from Maine to Maryland.

Her novel *Wilderhall* was an Indie Excellence Book Awards Finalist, and her stories and essays have appeared in literary journals such as *World Literature Today*, *Potomac Review*, and many others. Online publications include articles on nineteenth-century history in the *Victorian Web*, and essays in *Modern Literature* and *Flashes of Brilliance*.
