

A chamber music concert will take place at the Leroy Anderson House in Woodbury on Saturday, April 12 at 2:00 p.m.

Pianist Takeshi Nagayasu will perform Sonatas K.208 and K.29 by Scarlatti and the Piano Sonata in Bb minor, Op. 35 by Chopin.

Cellist Joseph Darcourt and Mr. Nagayasu will perform Sicilienne in Eb Major by Paradis and the Cello Sonata in G minor, Op. 65 by Chopin. The duo will perform Mr. Darcourt's arrangement for piano and cello of Debussy's Beau Soir and Leroy Anderson's Summer Skies.

Mr. Nagayasu studied at Juilliard, Yale, and is currently pursuing a doctoral degree in piano performance at the University of Michigan. He has performed in prominent venues such as Carnegie's Weill Recital Hall and Town Hall in New York City. Recent concerto performances include the Clara Schumann Philharmonic Orchestra in Germany and Ocean Foundation Festival Orchestra in New York.



American-born Peruvian-Taiwanese cellist Joseph Darcourt had his debut at Carnegie Hall at age 12. He received his training with Astrid Schween at the Juilliard School. Currently majoring in Neuroscience and Mathematics at Columbia University, Joseph is exploring music's profound impact on mental health.
